Founded in 1967, the mission of the North Carolina Fellows Program is to reimagine traditional understandings of leadership by engaging in meaningful dialogue, creating a supportive community, increasing self-awareness amongst its members, and encouraging positive change. First-year students are encouraged to apply for the NC Fellows Program to become engaged in this three-year cohort experience, where you will be engaged in deep and meaningful leadership learning. 25 first year students per cohort are admitted and together embark on a unique leadership development journey during their time at Carolina that includes both curricular and co-curricular components.
