Function of New Organizations on Campus

- New organizations bring a fresh perspective, ideas, and values to the Carolina Community.
- Incoming organizations approved to be an RSO (registered student organization) should not duplicate the purpose of existing organizations that are already established.



Application Timeline

10/1-10/11: Submit application on Heel Life

10/14: Notification of status via email

10/16: Confirm presentation time if moving forward

10/23: Submit final PowerPoint presentation

10/24 & 10/29: Presentations

10/31: Final notification by 12pm

Application Timeline

*Keep In Mind:

- There is no appeals process established for the new organization application window. If your proposal is denied, you are encouraged to apply next year.
- The new student organization committee will provide feedback on your proposal and reasoning behind denial.
- The student organizations team in SLL will provide support and opportunities to improve your proposal for the next application round.

Rubric & Scoring Methods

This rubric ensures that new proposals are evaluated for their uniqueness, long-term viability, and potential to contribute to the campus community.

Each category is rated from 1 to 5, with 5 being the strongest display of the criteria.

Feasibility and Sustainability


